<b>Job description</b>	<p>The position is attached to the Enterprise Chair "Smart City and Data Governance" (SCGD), at the Center for Innovation and Law (CID), University of Burgundy.</p> <p>The Greater Dijon (<i>Dijon Metropole</i>) leads and coordinates an H2020 project (RESPONSE) that brings together more than fifty European partners with the objective to develop innovative solutions for the production and consumption of energy in urban areas. To this end, private and public operators wish to create a "data lake" allowing pooling, processing and reuse of data collected by each of them. The post-doc will be the main interlocutor of the project partners for this report and will have to collect and centralize the relevant information for its preparation. He or she will have to analyze the legal issues raised by the collection and processing of this data. Finally, he or she will be responsible for writing the final report in English, by December 2021.</p>

	<p>The candidate will benefit of the expertise of researchers at the University of Burgundy but also of other Academics, or private and public partners involved in the project. All of these operations will be carried out under the direction of the head of the SCGD chair.</p> <p>The position is, in principle, located in Dijon (University of Burgundy) but may, given the current health situation, take the form of a full or partial remote participation. Trips to Dijon and in Europe will be necessary, when the health situation allows it.</p>
